Word from the Director

Go luath i mí Feabhra chífidh cuairteoirí ar an Cheathrú Ghaeltachta réad suntasach gorm ar an bhealach isteach chun na Cultúrlainne a chuirfeadh peireascóp ar fhomhuireán i gcuimhne duit.

Júcjhosca filíochta atá ann agus beidh sé chugainn tráth a mbeidh aird an phobail ar Bhríd, éarlasmh Críostaí agus bandia na filíochta in Éirinn. Tá ceiliúradh á dhéanamh agaínn ar dhánta, rainn agus véarsaí le filí as fud fad na tíre mar chuid de thionscnamh i gcomhar le Quotidian, eagras a chuireann an litríocht chun cinn i spásanna poiblí.

Dírigh do ghuthán ar na cód QR ar an júcjhosca go gcluinfidh tú taifid de na meadarachtaí agus rímeanna, nó brúigh ar an chnaipe leis na véarsaí a fhí isteach le fuaimdhreach Bhóthar na bhFál. Tá scór file páirteach sa togra agus beidh siompóisiam lae agaínn dóibh siúd ar suim leo tuilleadh a fhoghlaim faoi ealaín na filíochta.



Beidh saothar le ceathrar físealaíontóirí le feiceáil i nDánlann Dillon agus sna Ballaí Bána idir seo agus deireadh mhí Aibreáin bunaithe ar théamaí na féiniúlachta cultúrtha agus cearta.

Tá seoda gleuite d'imeachtaí agaínn fosta don aos óg, go háirithe le linn Fhéile Pháistí Bhéal Feirste i mí an Mhárta a bhíonn á heagrú ag Young At Art. Beidh An Scéaltacht ann le Laureate na nÓg, Áine Ní Ghlinn, agus Máire Zepf, agus beimid ag racáil le Branar a thiocfaidh chugainn an bealach ar fad as Gaillimh.

Beidh scoth an cheoil agaínn le Clann Mhic Corraidh as Béal Feirste – grúpa den scoth a bhfuil tóir mhór ag a leantóirí iomadúla orthu.

Táimid thar a bheith buíoch as a dtacaíocht leanúnach dár bpríomh-mhaoinitheoir, an Chomhairle Ealaíon, agus d'Fhoras na Gaeilge, Comhairle Cathrach Bhéal Feirste, Ciste Infheistíochta na Gaeilge, Ciste Oidhreachta an Chrannchuir Náisiúnta agus an Roinn Pobal.

From early February, visitors to the Gaeltacht Quarter will notice a strange, blue, periscope-like object near the door of An Chultúrlann. We're installing a poetry jukebox right around the time our thoughts turn to Brigid, matron saint of Ireland for Christians and goddess of poetry for our ancestors. We're celebrating verses, stanzas and rhymes with work by twenty poets from all over Ireland in partnership with Quotidian – Word on the Street, an organisation that promotes literature in public spaces. Point your phone at the QR codes on the jukebox to trigger audio recordings full of lyrical metre, or simply push the button to allow the poems to weave their way into the Falls Road soundscape. You may also wish to join us for a day long symposium at the

end of February and learn more about the art of poetry.

Between now and the end of April, work by four visual artists on the themes of cultural identity and rights will be exhibited in Dánlann Dillon and Na Ballaí Bána, and our young people can look forward to some wonderful events, especially during Young At Art's Belfast Children's Festival.

Laureate na nÓg, Áine Ní Ghlinn, and Máire Zepf, will visit for a storytelling session, and Branar will bring their magical brand of children's theatre to the Cultúrlann in March.

We are thrilled to be hosting St Patrick's Day concert with one of Ireland's most talented musical families – Belfast's own Clann Mhic Corraídh from Andersonstown. As always, we extend our deep gratitude for their ongoing support to our principal funder, the Arts Council of Northern Ireland, as well as Foras na Gaeilge, Belfast City Council, Ciste Infheistíochta na Gaeilge, The National Lottery Heritage Fund and the Department for Communities.

Insíonn An Chéad Bhean scéal bhantracht na hÉireann tríd an phéintéireacht agus saothar scríofa bunaithe ar phearsa na Caillí. Tagann an Chailleach aníos i saíocht agus oidhreacht na hÉireann. Is caractar í an Chailleach atá bunaithe ar íomhána urchóideacha a bhfuil cúmhacht dhochreidte acu nach raibh faoi smacht an Naisiúnachais ná na Críostaíochta. Sa taispeántas seo, léireofar í mar Aoife “damanta,” Ceasair dána, Mór-Ríoghain scáfar agus Sadhbh ghaisciúil.

Ag sníomh na finscéalaíochta agus na réadúlachta, is saothar meallacach é an taispeántas scéalaíochta seo atá á fhorbairt ag Eimear le 18 mí anuas. Tríd an rogha saothair seo, tá mé ag iarráidh tú a spreagadh le hamharc níos faide i gcéin ná an stair atá ag áiteanna agus sult agus tuiscint a bhaint as an áilleacht taobh istigh díobh.

Cuimsíonn mo shaothar píosaí ilathraitheacha arna spreagadh ag láithreacha agus sainchomharthaí thíre a n-aithnítear baint a bheith acu le cultúir amháin seachas a chéile, bunaithe ar na cultúir scartha anseo. Ag díriú an spotsolais ar áilleacht atá sofheicthe gach áit anseo, ach fios a bheith agat cá háit le hamharc, fíoráilleacht i ngach cultúr ar féidir sult a bhaint as gan réamhchlaonadh.

Traditional Cultures in this part of Ireland can often be abused and misused as a negative commentary, 'a stick to beat the other side with.' We are more than just flags and kerbstones.

All cultures have an intrinsic beauty within, which is often overlooked. My new series of work I have focused on aspects of the built landscape which have traditionally been associated with one or the other side. Buildings and locations such as Stormont Castle, Clonard Monastery, Milltown cemetery and Windsor Park, created intriguing symmetrical compositions divorced from its previous traditional associations. Through this selection of work, I want to encourage all to see beyond the history of a place and appreciate the beauty within.

My work is kaleidoscopic pieces drawn from locations and landmarks previously identified to be one or the other culture, from divided cultures here. Highlighting the beauty which is visible everywhere if you know how to look, a true beauty found in each culture which can be appreciated without prejudice.

Waiting for the Number 12 Noel Connor

Rugadh agus tógadh Noel Connor i mBaile Andarsan. Nuair a bhí sé óg, thaistil sé isteach agus amach as lár an bhaile ar bhus tralaí uimhir a 12. Cuirreadh stad le seirbhís na mbusanna tralaí ar an 12 Bealtaine 1968. Don togra seo, d'aimsigh sé agus d'oibrigh sé leis an bhus a rinne an t-aistear deireanach sin suas Bóthar na bhFál agus a chuaigh thart le hEaglais Phreispitéireach an Bhealaigh Leathain, Cultúrlann an lae inniu. Ag baint úsáid as scannánaíocht, filíocht, grianghraifadóireacht, fiosraíonn Noel cad chuige a bhfuil uimhir a 12 ag imeacht ó Shráid an Chaisleáin a fhad le Páirc Mhic Ásmaint chomh glinn sin ina chuimhní cinn. Fiosraíonn sé fosta na himeachtaí a thit amach ar an bhus agus ina thimpeall agus an t-aistriú ó shoineantacht go réadúlacht na seascaidí malla i mBéal Feirste. Bhí a shamhláiocht gafa ag castacht na línte cumhachta agus cáblaí a cheangail slite na mbusanna tralaí ó cheann ceann na cathrach agus aithníonn sé ní amháin a n-áilleacht shaoithiúil ach an suntas siombalach atá bainte leo mar shlite caillte ceanglainis agus cumarsáide.



Noel Connor was born and raised in Andersonstown and as a child he would have travelled into and out of town on the number 12 trolley bus. Trolley buses were finally withdrawn from service on the 12th May 1968. For this project he has tracked down and worked directly with the actual bus which made that very last journey along the Falls Road, passing Broadway Presbyterian Church, now Cultúrlann. Using film, poetry and photography, Noel explores why the number 12 from Castle Street to Casement Park features so conspicuously in his memory, examining how events on and around it capture a transition from innocence into the realities of late 1960's Belfast. The complicated web of power lines and cables which once connected these trolley bus routes across the city also caught his imagination, recognizing not only their curious beauty, but their symbolic significance as lost lines of connection and communication.


