Belfast TradFest: Tá Bean in Éirinn

Muireann Nic Amhlaoibh, Angelina Carberry, Caitlín Nic Gabhann, Doireann Ní Ghlacáin, Síle Denvir, Edwina Guckian

Tagann an teideal sin ó líne sa dán ‘Mná na hÉireann’ scríofa ag an fhile Peadar Ó Doirnín (1700–1769) as Oirdheisceart Uladh, agus is féidir go bhfuil aithne níos forleithne ar an dán sin mar amhrán ar chum Seán Ó Riada fonn dó in 1969. Anocht beidh muid ag déanamh ceiliúradh ar chuid de na ceoltóirí, na hamhránaithe agus na rinceoirí traidisiúnta baineanna is fearr in Éirinn.



PhD curtha i gcrích aici ar na mallaibh in OnÉG. Baineann cuid mhór dá tráchtas leis an cheol a ndearna Seán Ó Riada, a hathair mó, staidéar air.

Taken from a line in the poem *Mná na hÉireann* written by South East Ulster poet Peadar Ó Doirnín (1700–1769), and perhaps more widely known as a song set to an air by Seán Ó Riada in 1969, tonight is a celebration of some the finest female traditional musicians, singers and dancers in Ireland.

One of Ireland's favourite singers **Muireann Nic Amhlaoibh** is from west Kerry. She has had a long track record of producing critically acclaimed albums, as well as enjoying a successful broadcasting career on both television and radio. She toured the world as a member of Danú, and her song repertoire is as wide as it is deep.

TG4 Gradam Ceoil winner **Angelina Carberry** is an exceptional banjo player, known for her solid rhythm and delicate articulation. She is from a very well-known Longford musical family and she is steeped in the tradition. Quite simply, she is one of the best tenor banjo players of all time. **Caitlín Nic Gabhann** is a concertina player, performer, teacher, composer and percussive dancer. Having toured for years as a dancer with Riverdance, 3 time All-Ireland concertina champion Caitlín is a regular performer at festivals and concert halls from North America to Asia over the last 15 years.

Síle Denvir is a harpist and sean-nós singer who is deeply influenced by her upbringing in the Connemara Gaeltacht where she was surrounded by music and song from an early age. She is a founding member of the group Líadan, she has toured with The Chieftains.

Edwina Guckian has now taught her steps and shared the stage with some of Ireland's most influential acts such as Altan, De Danann, Dervish, Máirtín O'Connor, Frankie Gavin, Kíla, Martin Hayes, Séamus Begley, and Laoise Kelly to name a few. She set up Áirc Damhsa Culture Club for youths in her area to have a space to be immersed in traditions and cultures from home and all across the world in a fun and non-competitive environment. In April 2022, she was awarded the TG4 Gradam Comaoine for her outstanding contribution to culture.

Doireann Ní Ghlacáin hails from the north-side of Dublin, and is steeped in the rich musical tradition of the area. From her paternal family, The Glackin's, she learnt the fiddle under the tutelage of her father, Kevin Glackin. She has recently completed a PHD in NUIG. Much of her thesis relates to the music studied by her grandfather Seán Ó Riada.

D'eascair Lonesome George as saol an tseisiúin Fheirstigh le meascán de fhoinn thraigisiúnta agus cumadh amhráin nua-aimseartha. Ag croí an bhanna, tá an bheirt chumadóirí Joe Campbell-McArdle agus Myles McCormack, beirt seanchairde a chuaigh i ngleic leis an cheol traidisiúnta timpeall an ama chéanna agus a d'fhoghlaim i gcuideachta a chéile. In éineacht leo sa bhanna, tá an fliúiteadóir iomráiteach Stephen Loughran agus Dermot Moynagh ar ionann a stíl nua-aimseartha ar an bhodhrán agus cuisle fhuaim Bhéal Feirste.

Lonesome George have emerged from Belfast's session scene with an exciting fusion of traditional tunes and contemporary song writing that lends an immediacy to their sound that is rare to find. At the heart of the band is the song writing duo of Joe Campbell-McArdle and Myles McCormack, two old friends who approached traditional music at the same time and have learned alongside one another. They are joined by Stephen Loughran, a celebrated flute player and Dermot Moynagh, whose contemporary style on the bodhran has become the heartbeat of the sound of Belfast.

Beidh Ursula Burns agus Joby Fox ag cur seit bríomhar inár láthair lena gcuid amhrán nuachumtha féin. Ceoltóirí cumasacha iad beirt a d'fhás aníos in larthar Bhéal Feirste, cuireann siad dhá dhearcadh éagsúla chun tosaigh ar an téama céanna. Ursula ar chruit/canadh, Joby ar ghotár/

canadh. Deis iontach an bheirt ealaíontóirí seo a fheiceáil i suíomh a bheidh lom ach teolaí agus pearsanta. Ursula Burns and Joby Fox performing a dynamic in-the-round set with original songs. Both accomplished artists who grew up in West Belfast, they present two different takes on the same theme.

Ursula on harp/vocal, Joby on guitar/vocal. This is a rare opportunity to see these two artists in an informal setting up-close and personal and scaled back to the bare bones.

About Ursula Burns: Born on the Falls Road, Ursula's journey through music has been smashing the stereo-typical image of the harp by taking it on a journey through song writing, theatre, circus and comedy. Her roots and life growing up in Belfast are deeply ingrained in her writing. Her troubled relationship with her hometown led her to run away with the circus and embark upon a life on the road writing songs and performing everywhere from gypsy wagons to burning fire escapes and Tardis Imaginariums, Edinburgh Fringe Festival to the Royal Albert Hall.

Rugadh Daniel O'Neill (1920 - 1974), nó Dan mar is fearr aithne air i measc a chairde, an 21 Eanáir 1920 i Sráid Dimsdale in larthar Bhéal Feirste. Sna blianta i ndiaidh an chogaidh, thaistil sé go Páras agus bhí sé páirteach i ngrúpsheónna sa bhaile agus thar lear lena chairde Gerard Dillon, George Campbell, Colin Middleton agus Nevill Johnson. In 1952, moladh go mór sa bhaile agus go hidirnáisiúnta é as an taispeántas iardhearcach a d'eagraigh CEMA in larsmalann agus Gailearaí Ealaíne Bhéal Feirste. Tar éis tréimhse a chaitheamh i Londain sna 1960í, d'fhill sé ar Bhéal Feirste agus d'fhan sé ann go dtí a bhás in 1974.



Daniel O'Neill (1920-1974) or 'Dan' as he was known to his friends, was born on 21st January 1920 in Dimsdale Street in West Belfast. Mostly self-taught, he was tutored by the painter Sidney Smith at his studio in Howard Street where he was allowed the use of brushes and materials. In 1945 he was offered a gallery contract with Victor Waddington who at that time ran the leading gallery in Dublin specializing in contemporary art. In the post-war years, he traveled to Paris and

exhibited in group shows at home and abroad with friends, Gerard Dillon, George Campbell, Colin Middleton and Nevill Johnson. A retrospective exhibition at the Belfast Museum and Art Gallery in 1952, organized by CEMA led to critical acclaim at home and on the international stage. After a period in London in the 1960s, he returned to Belfast where he remained until his death in 1974.



Queer people have often been relegated to the margins of history, Art History especially, and their rights have been denied on the island of Ireland until recently. I gcaitheamh 2021, cuimhneachán caoga bliain bhuamáil Theach Tábhairne McGurk, thaifead Sinéad O'Neill-Nicholl comhráite le dhaoine muinteartha na ndaoine a fuair bás sa bhuamáil. Le teicníci iarléiriúcháin agus bogearraí eagarthóireacht fuaime, amharccan an t-ealaíontóir go grinn ar na struchtúir chumhachta a chruthaítar trí theanga i gcomhthéacs na firinne, an eolais agus an cheartais agus suim bhrefise aici sna modhanna a úsáidtear le guth 'an duine eile' a chur ina thost.

'Ní bheidh sé mar a bhí' consists of an audio installation of reconstructed recorded interviews with some of the



relatives of those killed in the McGurk's Bar bombing of 1971. The installation offers a public space for those who lost their relatives to share their personal memories of grief and loss and to recall the events in their own words outside of the political and media spotlight.

Over the course of 2021, the fiftieth anniversary year of the McGurk's Bar bombing, Sinéad O'Neill-Nicholl recorded conversations with the relatives of those who were killed in the bombing. Through post-production techniques and audio editing software the artist examines the power structures created through language in the context of truth, knowledge and justice and is further interested in the methods used to silence the voice of the 'other'.

Baineann an píosa feidhm fosta as tuairiscí pearsanta ar stailceanna ocras, coinneáil i ngaibhniú aonair agus an tionchar tubaisteach ar theaghlaigh.

Is léiriú é an radharc deiridh de dhiongháilteacht agus neart na ndaoine seo a raibh sé de phribhléid ag Maldoom aithne a chur orthu agus é ar cuairt ar Bhruach Thiar i seilbh Phalaistíneach agus i nGaza.

'We dance for life and freedom'.

This is the message that Palestinian company Diyar Theatre carries to audiences through its performances. Its work combines Palestinian folklore with contemporary dance in a way that conveys not only a passion for dance but a commitment to revitalising its national heritage.



Diyar Theatre's programme in Belfast will include folk dance (debkeh), performed by twelve talented and committed Palestinian dancers, who are keen to introduce their cultural and folk dance heritage to the world.

They will also perform 'Taken', a piece choreographed by Royston Maldoom and centred around the testimonies of Palestinian children who had been - and continue to be - held, usually without charges, in Israeli prisons.

The inspiration for Taken came from a television report, seen by Maldoom. It showed a young Palestinian girl called Tamimi, who, in an astonishing act of bravery, slapped an Israeli soldier who was trying to encroach on her family's property.

The piece also draws on personal testimonies of hunger strikes, detention in solitary confinement and their devastating effect on families.

Its final scene of defiance and strength characterises the people that Maldoom says he has been privileged to meet during his visits to the Palestinian occupied West Bank and Gaza.




